PERFORMING ARTS - CLASSICAL LITERATURE WORKSHOPS

This term the Performing Arts department have been collaborating with St Francis de Sales Catholic Junior School on a classical literature project. Students have taken part in a four week programme that studied classical theatre and characterisation in Shakespeare. The sessions also included introductory workshops on genre, stock character, physical theatre and film script. The students were outstanding and all received an NLA gold certificate of achievement. The group will be invited to our summer show, and are looking forward to further collaboration with the Performance Art faculty. We are also looking forward to working on a similar project with Leamington Community Primary School next term.



COMPUTING – LEGO ROBOTICS



The computing department have loved developing students reasoning ability and critical thinking skills during their Lego Robotics sessions again this term at Anfield Road, Emmaus Church of England and Catholic Primary School and Croxteth Community Primary. Each group meticulously tested their programming algorithms in preparation for the final programming challenge, where they were required to move a specific distance, rotate 360 degrees and then ensure the robot returned exactly to its original starting position.
